For the first time in its history, the Church of England is publishing daily and seasonal services of morning and evening prayer.

Daily Prayer will help people pray every day, throughout the Christian year. Whether alone or in groups, individuals can now link their personal devotions into the shared praying life of the Church.

We are confident that the new book will appeal to those who already find a daily quiet time beneficial, as well as reaching out to those searching for a regular spiritual rhythm to their lives.

What is in *Daily Prayer*?

This rich new resource includes a wealth of seasonal variants, collects, psalms and other devotional materials. There are orders of service for morning, evening and night prayer for each day of the week, and each season of the Church's year.

New material

The section entitled *Prayer During the Day* is a completely new development, specially written for those wanting to enrich their daily quiet time and to develop a regular pattern of prayer. There are helpful cycles of intercession topics both for daily and seasonal use. The canticle section includes a unique selection of scripture-based material. The Psalter features specially written prayers to complement each psalm.

New and yet already familiar

Daily Prayer has taken much of its inspiration and shape from the hugely successful Franciscan prayer book *Celebrating Common Prayer*, with many of the same people involved in the compilation of both. Users of CCP will find that there is much that is familiar in *Daily Prayer*.

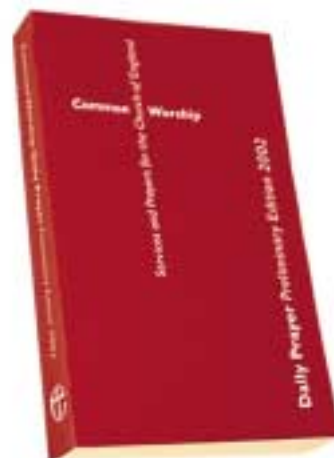

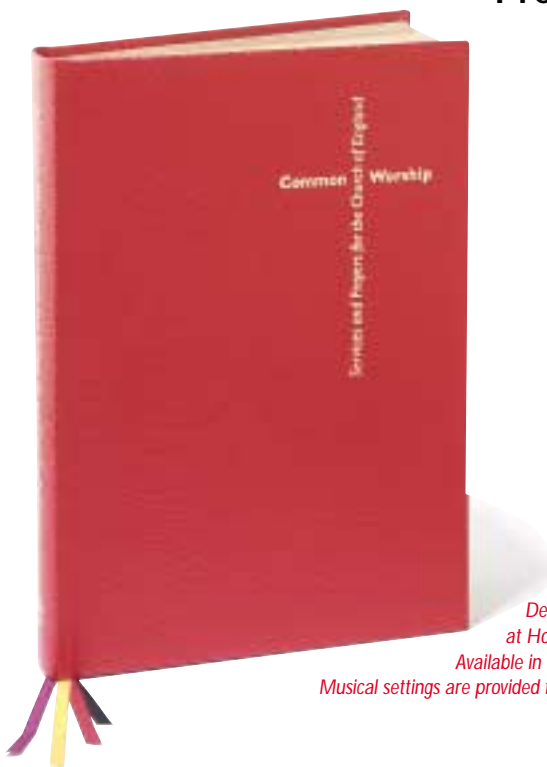

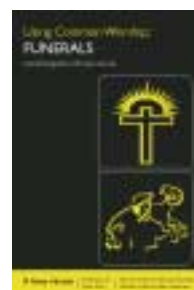
